## **Fort Lewis**

New home for the famous 9th Infantry Division

Already the 9th Infantry Division is being acclaimed as "The Northwest Division."

Its re-activation at Fort Lewis May 26th 1972 marks the first stake to that claim; intensive recruiting in the Pacific Northwest through the unit of choice enlistment program reinforces it.

Organization of the division here this spring is not the first time the Octofoil has been seen at Fort Lewis, although it is the first that any of its units have been stationed at "The Army Center of the Northwest."

In July, 1969, the 3d Battalion, 60th Infantry of the division's 2nd Brigade became the first Army unit to return from Vietnam under President Richard M. Nixon's troop drawdown plan.

Soldiers of the battalion were billeted here for two days after receiving a tumultous welcome at nearby McChord AFB, then paraded in downtown Seattle before formally inactivating here.

A few weeks later, the "Go Devil's of the 3d Brigade were inactivated in ceremonies here.

This is at least the seventh stateside post that has been home to the division or its elements. The 9th Infantry Division was first organized at Camp Sheridan, Ala., in July 1918. At the same time, its Field Artillery units were formed at Camp McClellan, Ala.

The division began its training for combat but Armistice was signed before it could deploy to France.

In World War II, the 9th trained at Ft. Bragg, N.C. It was inactivated after the war, but reactivated July 15, 1947 as a training division at Ft. Dix, N.J.


In 1954 the 28th Division in Germany was redesignated the 9th, and in the fall of 1956 rotated under "Operation Gyroscope" to Ft. Carson, Colo. It was there until early 1962.

Inactive four years, it next was recalled to active duty at Ft. Riley, Kan. It trained there for deployment to Vietnam early in 1967.

At Fort Lewis, units of the 9th occupy barracks which for nearly six years housed an infantry training center and Army personnel center. Plans called for others to move into modern, concrete and glass billets on the main post in what has been known as the "Division Area" since it was occupied by troops of the 4th Infantry Division in the late 1950's and early '60's.





3d BATTALION, 5th CAVALRY (BLACK KNIGHTS)

Constituted 3 March 1855 in the Regular Army as Company C, 2d Cavalry

Organized May - June 1855 at Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania

Redesignated 3 August 1861 as Company C, 5th Cavalry

(Cavalry companies officially designated as troops in 1883)

(5th Cavalry assigned in December 1917 to the 15th Cavalry Division; relieved in May 1918 from assignment to the 15th Cavalry Division; assigned 18 December 1922 to the 1st Cavalry Division; dismounted 28 February 1943 and reorganized 4 December 1943 partly under cavalry and partly under infantry tables of organization and equipment; reorganized wholly as infantry 20 July 1945 but retained cavalry designations)

Inactivated 1 February 1928 at Fort Clark, Texas

Activated 1 August 1940 at Fort Clark, Texas

Redesignated 25 March 1949 as Company C, 5th Cavalry

(5th Cavalry relieved 15 October 1957 from assignment to the 1st Cavalry Division)

Inactivated 15 November 1957 in Japan

Redesignated 15 April 1958 as Headquarters and Headquarters Troop, 3d Reconnaissance Squadron, 5th Cavalry (organic elements concurrently constituted)

Squadron assigned 1 July 1958 to the 9th Infantry Division and activated at Fort Carson, Colorado

Inactivated 31 January 1962 at Fort Carson, Colorado

Redesignated 1 February 1966 as the 3d Squadron, 5th Cavalry, and activated at Fort Riley, Kansas

Inactivated 16 March 1987 at Fort Lewis, Washington, and relieved from assignment to the 9th Infantry Division

Redesignated 16 October 1988 as the 3d Battalion, 5th Cavalry, assigned to the 3d Armored Division, and activated in Germany
